As new members join us and previous members return to worship with us, we are starting to grow our congregation again. Let us all work together to stabilize our finances and grow our membership so that we can look forward to going to a full-time Pastor in the future.

Linda Roland did mention the possibility of folks donating to Birdies for Charity through the Heritage Classic Foundation and designating their donation to WELCA.



Mary Lee's suggestion about teaching people how to usher, etc. was heard by Mike Himes of the Worship and Music committee and he will discuss this with his committee.


